MY WORK

I teach, because the classroom is a place of transformation and friendship

- At VST I teach across the curriculum, in history, bible, theology, and practical fields.
- Recent offerings: the nature and work of the Holy Spirit, learning preaching from the black church, introduction to public and pastoral ministry, the doctrine of the Trinity.
- I have evaluated or supervised doctoral dissertations at Garrett-Evangelical and Northern Seminaries (Illinois), Durham and Aberdeen Universities (UK), and the Toronto School of Theology (Canada).

I notice, since writing requires practice as a “first-rate noticer”

- I have written on faith and life for local outlets in Chicago IL (*Christian Century*), Durham NC (*Faith & Leadership*), Boone NC (*Watauga Democrat*), and Vancouver BC (*The Vancouver Sun*).
- Quoted in *The Washington Post*, *USA Today*, *Time*, and consulted by dozens of other venues.
- Northern Lights: Resurrecting Church in the North of England* (Cascade), a new book on growing churches from my sabbatical time in Durham, England.
- Regularly consulted for book endorsements and scholarly reviews of books and papers.

I write compulsively and collectively – to figure out what might be true

- 10 solo-authored volumes published by Eerdmans, Baker, Abingdon and Cascade. Foreworders include Martin Marty, Robert Jenson, Sam Wells, Joas Adiprasetya, and Will Willimon.
- Topics include scripture (*Surprised by Jesus Again*, *Psalms III*, *Praise Seeking Understanding*), church and life (*Trinity*, *Discerning the Body*), the new shape of ministry (*The Gifts of the Small Church*), recovering ancient practices (*The Sayings of the Desert Fathers*, *Reading Augustine*), and technology (*Following*).
- More than 350 articles for such venues as *Christianity Today*, *Religion News Service*, *Sojourners*, *Theology Today*, *Journal for Preachers*, and others.

I preach, because the gospel is not *for* us, but *through* us, *for* everybody else

- Interim pastorates at First Baptist Church, Vancouver, with the United Church of Canada’s campus ministry at UBC, and at Vancouver Chinese Presbyterian Church.
- Regular guest preacher at Tenth Church, a multi-site and multi-racial megachurch in Vancouver.
- Hundreds of guest preaching opportunities in eight Canadian provinces, 26 US states, and six other countries.
- Highlights include Durham Cathedral (UK), Duke Chapel (NC), Metropolitan AME (Washington DC), Christ Church United Methodist (New York City), Wycliffe College (Toronto), Jesus and Selwyn Colleges at Cambridge University (UK), Christ Commission

Fellowship (the Philippines), St. Andrew's and St. Paul's Presbyterian (Montreal), and the American Church in Paris (France).

I learn, since being a theologian, like being a disciple, is a never-settled practice

· Hundreds of interviews for *Christian Century* and *Faith & Leadership*, seeking the patterns of God's work in the church and the world.

· Curious about Pacific Rim Christianity, I have taught often at Vancouver Chinese Presbyterian, Vancouver Taiwanese Presbyterian, and Vancouver Chinese Evangelical Free Church.

· My Trinity book is forthcoming in Indonesian translation with BPK Gunung Mulia (Jakarta).

· Presentations in Jewish settings (Or Shalom Synagogue, Limmud Vancouver, and regularly in inter-faith programming at VST) undo easy patterns of thought and teach me to stammer again.

· New project afoot on the faith of Asian Canadian Christian immigrants to Vancouver emphasizing their contributions in medicine, law, engineering, government, teaching, and elsewhere.

I collaborate, because learning is a communal endeavor and power must be shared

· I have co-taught courses with Laura Duhan Kaplan (Jewish), Ross Lockhart & Richard Topping (Presbyterian), Paul Burns (Catholic at St. Mark's), and Jens Zimmerman (German evangelical at Regent College), Miroslav Volf and Tim Perry (Anglicans at Yale and Providence Seminary, respectively).

· I have taught as an adjunct at Persetia (Indonesia), Duke Divinity School, Wheaton College, Northern Seminary, Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary, and North Park Theological Seminary (the last four in Illinois).

· Co-written books with Andria Irwin, Ross Lockhart, Matt Miofsky, and Rae Jean Proeschold-Bell on technology, missional churches in Cascadia, growing Methodist church plants, and clergy health.

· Co-edited volumes with Roger Owens, Craig Kocher, James Howell, and John Buchanan on mentoring, the legacy of Eugene Peterson, and the history of the *Christian Century*. Forthcoming Festschrift for Jonathan R. Wilson coedited with Jeremy Kidwell (University of Birmingham, UK).
